SHLCS-A13-2024-Antipsyc	Antipsychotic Drug (Depot) Injection Administration in General Practice
KEY ELEMENTS	 Reimbursement for administration of Antipsychotic Depot injections A register - Providers should be able to produce and maintain an up-to-date register of all patients receiving anti-psychotic medication (LAIs) Call and recall - A robust, systematic and responsive recall system to ensure that patients receive their injection at the relevant time interval. Robust mechanisms must be in place to deal with non-attendees Re-referral policies Where appropriate, to refer patients promptly to the specialist service or liaise with them for advice.
OF SPECIAL NOTE	 Individual re-referral CMHRS team contacts are listed for each PCN in the Specification Interlinks with the SMI Physical Health Check LCS – must be provided
RISKS	 Multiple eligibility criteria: Stable on medication >6 months, compliant with treatment plan & no DNAs in 6 months Offered and agreed to Shared Care for their LAI in General Practice On treatment intervals of at least two weeks. Must have a Shared Care Plan which describes Crisis and Contingency Plan and Treatment Plan Physical health monitoring requirements as documented in the relevant Shared Care Guidelines (available on the Prescribing Advisory Database (PAD) https://surreyccg.res-systems.net/PAD/ GP Practice to confirm happy to accept Shared Care through the acceptance of the Shared Care Guideline (see Annex B of individual drug Shared Care Guideline) Reliant on SABP being responsive in re-referral situations
PRACTICE CONSIDERATIONS	 SOP needed for how to manage DNAs Must be aware of Physical Health Monitoring required for specific medication
