Phlebotomy services for housebound patients in Surrey are usually commissioned from Community Service Providers and should be referred according to local arrangements (-see page 4) Guildford & Waverley only – practices will be permitted at this time to claim for domiciliary phlebotomy visits for housebound patients who are not on the community services caseload; this is due to current commissioning arrangements, which will be reviewed soon.
